Kathleen's paper "A Systematic Review and Meta-Analysis Examining the Impact of Incident Postoperative Delirium on Mortality" was published in Anesthesiology. Dr. Norman Buckley, had his project, "Impact of ENIGMA trials on Nitrous Oxide: A Survey of Canadian Anesthesiologists and Residents" published in the Canadian Journal of Anesthesiology. Denise, supervised by Dr. Harsha Shanthanna, presented "A Systematic Review on Opioid Free Analgesic Techniques for Supratentorial Craniotomies" at the American Society of Regional Anesthesia. Scott presented "Sedation During Vitreoretinal Surgery: Practice Patterns in Canada" at the Canadian Ophthalmological Society Meeting and Exhibition and was supervised by Drs. This CIHR doctoral award recognizes Jessica's work on evaluating Functional Outcomes of Adults Undergoing Cardiac Surgery. Jessica collaborated with Steven Long (PGY1) and is supervised by Dr. Summer Syed and Dr. Yannick Le Manach. As well, Dr. Anne Scheidecker, a fellow in the Pain Residency Program, was recognized with a MacPherson Leadership in Teaching and Learning Fellowship to further her work in medical education and simulation.

Noticeable standouts at the Canadian Anesthesiologists' Society Meeting in Montreal include Jessica, Justine, and Scott who presented their work. Newly graduated resident **Jessie Ursenbach** presented her abstract **"Incidence of Failure of Resited Epidurals in La-bouring Parturients"**, supervised by Drs. Annemaria De Tina, Ryan Smith, and Cyndie Horner.

The Simulation Olympics also took place at this year's meeting. Resident teams from across the country participated in an elimination round style of competition based on their performance in simulation scenarios. Congratulations to **Justine, Scott, and Jeff Overington (PGY4)** for placing first among 8 other teams in the competition, winning a \$3000 prize for their quick thinking, excellent judgement, and terrific knowledge. Fourth place was a mixed team of residents from various institutions including **Rui Hu** from McMaster—the only medical student to participate in the Simulation Olympics. The competition would not have been possible without the hard work of **Natalie Lidster (PGY4)**, who was instrumental to the design and success of the event.

The American Society of Anesthesiologists Annual meeting (October) in San Francisco included presentations from Jeff Overington and Dillon Horth (PGY3). Dr. Richard McLean, Hamilton Health Sciences Chief of Anesthesia, Says Goodbye After 34 Years

Dr. Richard (Dick) McLean will be retired in October after a distinguished career in anesthesia, research, critical care and medical administration.

Dick joined HHS in 1998 as the Chief of Anesthesia and as an Associate Professor at McMaster University. Prior to that, he worked in leadership roles in critical care at Sunnybrook Health Sciences Centre in Toronto. When he arrived in Hamilton, he was challenged with merging the Hamilton Civics Department of Anesthesia with the Anesthesia Department at McMaster. Dick very successfully shepherded the group to become one cohesive Department under the HHS umbrella. After serving two terms as Chief of Anesthesia he joined the hospital's executive team in 2009 as the Vice President of Medical Affairs and Quality. One of his key accomplishments in that role was his leadership in Continuous Quality Improvement and this work has resulted in

over 1000 improvements in the hospital. We congratulate Dick in his

retirement and thank him for his many contributions to anesthesia, critical care and hospital quality over his 34-year career.

A special thank you to Dr. Raymer's contribution as the Program Director for the past four-plus years.
